> Introduction of the Institution

Sultan-ul-Uloom College of Pharmacy, Hyderabad, Telangana.

Sultan-ul-Uloom College of Pharmacy was established in the year 1997 under the aegis of Sultan-ul-Uloom Education Society. It is approved by Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), and affiliated to Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Hyderabad (JNTUH). It is recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. It has 8 University Gold Medallists. The institution focused on quality education and continuous improvement. The institution has continued to exhibit strong academic performance through efforts of qualified faculty, trained supporting staff, need based capital investment on sophisticated lab equipment and above all the unflinching support by the Management of Sultan-ul-Uloom Education Society.

Solid and Liquid Waste Management in Campus

The waste generated in the institution needs to be managed in a scientific manner in order to reduce adverse environmental impact. The most commonly handled waste is solid waste and liquid waste. Apart from these two categories of waste, the third important category is Biodegradable waste and E-waste. The concept of E-waste management is relatively new but it is equally important in view of the hazardous nature of the waste. The steps taken by the college towards management of each of the above types of waste are described below:

Solid waste management:

Primary collection is done through dust bins placed throughout the campus at strategically convenient locations and the secondary collection is done by the Municipal Corporation vehicle which visits the campus every day. Throwing of waste in open spaces is strictly prohibited and usage of plastic bags is discouraged within the premises of the College.

Liquid waste management:

The liquid waste generated from laboratories, cleaning, washing, housekeeping and disinfecting activities is directed through proper channels to be discharged in to the sewerage system which is connected to the city underground sewerage system of the Water Supply and Sewerage Board. The grey water from canteen, wash area is directed to a recycling sump and the same is used for gardening purpose.

♣ Biomedical waste management:

The College takes efforts in minimizing the production and proper disposal of bio-hazardous wastes. The college has a contract with biomedical waste management agencies for bio medical waste disposal services.

E-waste management:

The various components of E-waste generated in the campus consists of computer systems, electronic components used in the laboratories, printers etc. Outdated computer systems are repaired and updated. Computer systems which are damaged and not in working condition, electrical and electronic instruments and components are disposed through E-Waste scarp dealers by adopting a transparent system.

Campus Greenery

The Institution has a team of horticulturist and gardeners that maintain 70% greenery and landscape of the campus. Different types of trees have been planted in and around the campus area. Sprinklers are used for watering the plants and wastewater from the sewage treatment plant is used in horticulture.

Energy Conservation

- Implementing energy saving techniques to ensure that the lights and fans are switched off by floor attenders and staff after completion of the lasts lecture of the day Effect.
- Classrooms are made with sufficient cross ventilation and light so that the use of electricity can be minimized.
- More usage of CFL and LED should be done for energy consumption.
- Electrical devices are switched off when not in use.
- Master Switches for each Room to shut down power of entire room when not in use .
- Minor steps like shutting down computers when not in use, turning off computer monitors or other electric appliances at the end of the day etc. were practiced.
- Students are directed to use staircase for minimum floors to minimize the energy consumption by the use of lift.

Water Management

Rain water harvesting structures and utilization in the campus

The college campus has three rain water harvesting pits which are well maintained and registered by the local Municipal Authorities. These rain water harvesting pits are planned to divert the rain water from roofs of different block to these pits.

These pits are located at:

PIT- 1: Situated in the western side of campus, adjacent to Workshops (Block III) covering the
entire area of Civil and Mechanical Engineering laboratories, open land near Gate 2 of the
campus etc. The approximate catchment area of this rain water harvesting pit is about 8
acre.

The size of this pit $10' \times 10' \times 7'$.

 PIT – 2: Situated in the eastern side of the campus adjacent to Football Ground covering a catchment area of about 4 acre.
 The size of this pit 10' x 7' x 7

3. PIT - 3: Behind MBA building in the south- eastern side of the campus covering a catchment area of about 4 acre.





Hygiene and medical awareness camps were organized in these villages from time to time. The college has taken an initiative to organize 'Clean India' programme from 1st October to 31st October 2021 under the Department of Youth Affairs, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports to create an overall awareness regarding the collection of waste, mainly single use plastic waste and traditional water resources.

To start with, our team conducted few brainstorming and idea-pooling sessions to draft a complete schedule of activities. So, that the idea of 'Clean India' gets delivered in a more creative manner. The adopted villages were selected based on the following factors: -



Collection, segregation and Disposal Biomedical waste management, laboratory waste management Administration of waste management

Eg: The solid waste generated is mostly papers, answer sheets and waste from kitchen and toilets. The waste paper recycling plant converts waste paper into new papers, file covers, sheets, note pads etc. Dry and wet waste is segregated in separate bins and the garbage is cleared twice a day. Kitchen waste is processed in a vermin compost plant. Weeds, leaves and other garden waste are deposited in organic pits for generation of compost. Liquid waste generated from washrooms, kitchen, laundry etc. are treated in the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) installed in the campus. The treated wastewater from the STP is reused through double plumbing technique for horticulture purpose. The residual water from vermin composting plant is collected in organic pit and used as a pesticide. Rain water harvesting pits are used for conservation of rain water. Untreated wastes are collected in the garbage disposal bins. Biomedical waste and lubricating oil discharged from generator sets are collected by the government approved vendors.

5. Hostel Kitchen Facilities (10 lines)

Eg: The University has automated and modern kitchens with chimney and multiple exhausts, well maintained servers and cold storage rooms. Kitchen staff is well-groomed and appropriately dressed. LPG is used as the cooking medium and provided with mechanized food preparation units. There is provision of round-the-clock supply of safe drinking water. There are regular food quality checks by the mess committee members. Dedicated staff maintains the hygiene and cleanliness of the kitchen and dining areas.

6. Campus Greenery (10 lines)

Area under green cover (%), nursery on campus, plant protection management, tree plantations, exotic, medicinal, local species plants

Eg: The University has a team of horticulturist and gardeners that maintain 70% greenery and landscape of the campus. Over 3500 different types of trees have been planted in and around the campus area. An In-house nursery caters to the need of tree plantation programs. Hydroponic farming techniques adopted by the university has a production capacity of 18 -20 kgs. of vegetables per day. Sprinklers are used for watering the plants and wastewater from the sewage treatment plant is used in horticulture. Saplings are protected by the use of organic pesticides and in-house prepared compost. Plant markers indicating nomenclature and species information are displayed at the designated spots. Bee keeping on the campus induced pollination of many flowering plants.

The college has undertaken COVID counselling sessions for the students. The college distributed 150 Kirana kits of essential commodities to the needy migrants and slum dwellers in addition to other activities. As the college is surrounded by lot of residents, the premises were lent for the reach of the people to run weekly vegetable market. Student volunteers ensure that social distancing is followed at vegetable market where crowds gather and also volunteer to help police and sanitary workers in their work.

The college created awareness about corona virus and precautions to be taken to prevent its spread among the student community college website and social media.

The approved Policy must contain at the following:

- a. Sanitation and hygiene policy: Maintenance of cleanliness and institutionalization of monitoring processes.
- b. Water conservation policy: Optimum use of water, reuse of treated water, water saving appliances and water recycling.
- c. Rain water harvesting policy: porous pavements and rainwater harvesting structures.
- d. Waste Management Policy: 5 R principles of reduce, reuse, recycle, refuse and regenerate as well as reducing waste sent to landfill to less than 10% of waste generated. Banning all plastic disposable items from the campus is the first step. Drawing lessons from Swachh campaign for handling computer & electronic equipment and other e-wastes.
- e. Energy conservation policy: Introduction of solar energy and reduction in energy consumption through technologies and management processes.
- f. Greening Policy: Growing endemic and endangered species of trees covering at least 33% of land area on campus.
- g. Student Activity Policy: 'Maintenance of Swachhata during students' cultural programs and any student activities.
